- Please email or drop off your calendars to the rectory by May 30th. this will give us more time to look into any conflicts in the schedule.
 - Please make sure you mention the name of the event, and its date and time.
 - There are a few days in the year when our staff cannot be present to help so we cannot entertain events on those days. Those days are the day after Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter.
 - Every night all the premises must be tidy and closed before midnight so to make sure things go smoothly we ask that all events be completed by 11:30 PM.
 - Some events will likely conflict with one another, in which case we need to be able to reach you to discuss it.
- So please mention you name, email address and/or phone number in the calendar.
- **The Centennial Hall is used extensively during the month of July for the Festival so it is not available for hosting other meetings. Additionally, we perform maintenance work in it during August so it remains closed following the Festival through Labor Day.**
 - Please keep in mind the two annual fundraising Events – the Parish Auction (March 1, 2015; setup Feb.28, 2015) and the Festival (July 24,25,26, 2015). Additionally, the Festival Committee schedules 'pre-festival fundraisers' to help fund the Festival Entertainment – "A Nite at the Races" (April 25, 2015), and one or two "Atlantic City Trips" during the months of March and May. Safeguarding Children and Addressing Abuse

The Archdiocese Responds to all Allegations Quickly and Appropriately

In line with Archbishop Myers' personal directive and a Memorandum of Understanding with County Prosecutors, the Archdiocese reports all allegations of sexual abuse of minors to the local County Prosecutor, and cooperates with law enforcement investigations.

Those accused of abuse are temporarily removed from ministry or assignment while investigations are ongoing. If the allegation is substantiated, the removal is permanent.

Since his arrival in 2001, Archbishop Myers

has removed permanently from ministry 19 priests against whom allegations were substantiated and who faced penalties under Church law. Only two Archdiocesan priests have been convicted or pleaded guilty to criminal charges involving minors during this same time, and both have resigned or been dismissed from the priesthood. No Archdiocesan priest has been charged with a crime involving minors since 2004.

Holy Hour

Holy Hour takes place every Tuesday from 3 to 4 PM in St. Anne's Convent Chapel.



Spiritual Bouquets are available from the rectory. Each comes with a special Father's Day card.





Pope John Paul II wrote a letter to artists and told them that one cannot be in the presence of a work of beauty and not in some way be transformed. In fact, it was Dostoevsky who wrote that “beauty will save the world.” More recently, Pope Francis in *The Joy of the Gospel*, calls for catechesis to “attend to the way of beauty” recognizing that “every expression of true beauty: can lead to an encounter with Jesus (\$167). This forum led by Fr Anthony Ciorra will present a vision for spiritual life for the twenty-first century that will invite all of us to become “Ministers of God’s Beauty”, who invite

Pope Francis

Share The Wealth

Pope Francis encouraged the Secretary General of the United Nations, Ban Ki-moon and other UN executives whom he received in the Vatican on May 12, to promote “a true, worldwide ethical mobilization” that will spread and put into practice a shared ideal of fraternity and solidarity, especially with regard to the poorest and those most excluded,” rejecting an “economy of exclusion”, a “culture of waste” and a “culture of death”.

The Holy Father received the executives from the United Nations Agencies, Funds and Programmes on Friday, led by UN Secretary General Ban Ki-moon in the Consistory hall in the Apostolic Palace. The UN body has about fifty officials, ranging from the president of the World Bank to the head of the World Health Organisation, which is currently its biannual meeting in Rome.

“I thank all of you, who are primarily responsible for the international system, for the great efforts being made to ensure world peace, respect for human dignity, the protection of persons, especially the poorest and most vulnerable, and harmonious economic and social development,” Pope Francis said addressing his audience in Spanish. He praised “the results of the Millennium Development Goals, especially in terms of education and the decrease in extreme poverty,” but he also urged them to bear in mind “that the world’s peoples deserve and expect even greater results.

“In the case of global political and economic organization, much more needs to be achieved, since an important part of humanity does not share in the benefits of progress and is in fact relegated to the status of second-class citizens. Future Sustainable Development Goals must therefore be formulated and carried out with generosity and courage, so that they can have a real impact on the structural causes of poverty and hunger, attain more substantial results in protecting the environment, ensure dignified and productive labour for all, and provide appropriate protection for the family, which is an essential element in sustainable human and social development.

“Specifically, this involves challenging all forms of injustice and resisting the “economy of exclusion”, the “throwaway culture” and the “culture of death” which nowadays sadly risk becoming passively accepted.”
